LENT HAS BEGUN...

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, February 6th, our season of Lent began and it will continue through 40 days and 40 nights (excluding our Sunday Sabbath days of rest). This journey leads us to Holy Week when we come to make the choice to walk with Jesus through the last days of his life. Yet we can go boldly in the knowledge that the Spirit of God will uphold us through all times.

Holy Week begins Sunday, March 16th with our celebration of Palm/Passion Sunday at both churches. This was the time when the disciples joyfully entered Jerusalem with Jesus and the local people cheered and greeted him as a hero.

But things quickly changed and we will gather at Lowville on Thursday, March 20th at 7 pm on the day known as 'Maundy Thursday'. We will remember Jesus last supper and the last night

before his crucifixion. This was a sacred time and on this night Jesus gave his disciples a new commandment [maundy comes from the word 'mandate'] to love one another as Jesus loves us.

Then, on Friday, March 21st at 11 am at Nelson, on the day that we dare to call 'good' we will gather for our Good Friday service; coming to the foot of the cross where Jesus died and we will come together to remember.

Holy Saturday follows this sorrowful time and remains for us, a day of reflection before Easter rises with the dawn of Easter Sunday.

And what a celebration! On March 23rd we will greet Easter with warm hearts as we celebrate Christ's resurrection and our salvation! And we will be greeting the dawn at a sunrise service held at Lowville Park at 7 am. It will be followed with a time of fellowship and refreshment before our Easter services which will be held at their regular times at both churches.

New Joint Mission Project

SAVE THOSE MILK BAGS TO CREATE SLEEPING MATS

This project, when you hear about it sounds a bit unusual but back in 2001 some creative women from Fisherville, Ontario, launched a project that transforms those milk bags into crocheted, attractive, durable, washable sleeping mats. These mats are then distributed by missionaries in Africa to people who have no alternative but to sleep on the ground.

- It takes 250 bags to create a sleeping mat.
- Costs of shipping are \$0.00 because the mats are used as packing materials around fragile items on route.
- The sleeping mats come in two sizes, 36x65 and 30x45 inches.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

- Save the 4Litre OUTER bags (not the small litre inner bags)
- Wash, thoroughly dry and fold flat each bag.
- Place the bags in the Church container (a clothing bag for Nelson and a bright yellow shopping bag for Lowville)

'United For Peace' Campaign

In November, The United Church of Canada launched a two-year United for Peace Campaign. We have a financial goal of \$2 million. Half will be designated to peace building in Israel and Palestine; the remainder will support peace projects around the world. This campaign runs until December 31, 2009 and will promote peace work already started through our church's Mission and Service (M&S) Fund.

How can you help? One way is purchasing a 'one-of-a-kind' olivewood pin made in Bethlehem. (See Barbara's stole on Sunday!) Uniquely designed by a local carver, the pin displays the campaign's logo of a dove carrying an olive branch. Cost is \$30.00 but you receive a tax donation receipt for \$25.00 - only \$5.00 goes to the cost of the pin; the rest will build peace around the world.

If you bake, there are cookie cutters in the shape of a dove for only \$1.00 with the hope that members will use their skills to raise funds by baking and selling United for Peace cookies.

The Lowville-Nelson Website

The following was provided by Bob McKeown, following his recent successful attempts to keep the Lowville-Nelson website operating with both existing and new names. As can be seen, this transpired over the period of approximately one year. Our thanks to Bob for his diligent work to keep the website up and running through this difficult time.

Lowville Nelson Visibility Ministry

Have you noticed that the church website has a new name www.lowville-nelson.ca? The name change was made to better reflect the pastoral charge Lowville-Nelson United Ministries, the other names www.nelsonunited.ca and www.lowvilleunited.ca still work. The following is a less apparent reason why the name was changed and illustrates Murphy's Law at it's "best".

All domain names ending in .ca are regulated by the Canadian Internet Registration Authority (CIRA). Only Canadians are entitled to have a domain name that ends in .ca and CIRA has the mandate to enforce this regulation. The domain name nelsonunited.ca was registered years ago by the internet hosting company and one of their company officials was identified as the registrant (owner) of the domain name nelsonunited.ca.

A year ago nelsonunited.ca was moved to another hosting company. The changes to reflect the move could not be fully made with CIRA. At this time, my email became associated with the Registrant from the original hosting company and I started to receive notices for .ca domain names I did not own.

I received an email from CIRA telling me that unless it could be proven that the original registrant was a Canadian citizen, CIRA would suspend nelsonunited.ca in 5 days.

At this time, a decision was made to obtain the new domain lowville-nelson.ca because the likelihood of

being able to comply with the CIRA ultimatum appeared to be slim.

I contacted the original hosting company and found that the person who was identified as the registrant still worked there. I sent him the documentation from CIRA and he called me immediately. He expressed amazement that CIRA would be enforcing these regulations and submitted the required proof to CIRA that he is a Canadian.

The next problem to be solved was to eliminate my email being associated with his name. To accomplish this, I transferred the domain name to him and he then transferred it back to me. If this sounds confusing, let me assure you, it was.

Once the domain name was transferred back to me, there were still problems with CIRA official documentation.

It took many weeks of back and forth communications with CIRA to finally get them to correct the information.

The hero of this tale is Mike Fillator of Dotcanada.com. Mike spent substantial time to resolve these problems. To say that I am appreciative of his endeavors is an understatement.

On behalf of Lowville-Nelson United Ministries, a huge thank you goes to Mike Fillator.
